Indoor Tiebreaker Rules (applies to matches with a 2-hour time limitation)

If there is a 2-hour time limit on the courts, matches will be completed using league indoor rules as follows:

At 10 minutes prior to the end of the 2-hour block, a game in progress should be completed using no-ad scoring.

After that game:

- If a team is leading by 2 games or more in the set in progress, the set is awarded to that team.
- If a team is leading by 1 game in the set in progress, another no-ad game will be played. If the leading team wins the second game (putting them up by two games), they are awarded the set. However, if this game results in the two teams being tied, a 9-point tie-break will be played to determine the set.
- If the teams are tied in the set in progress, a 9-point tie-break will be played to determine the set.

If teams split sets, a 9-point tie-break will be played to determine the winner of the match.

- A 9-point tie-break is the first to 5 points (no need to win by 2).
- If the 9-point tie-break is tied 4-4, next point is receiver's choice.
- Each player serves twice, starting from the deuce side.
- There is no switching sides, the entire tiebreaker is played with all players remaining on the same sides of the court from where they start.

Note:

- For the first set, a regular 12-point tiebreaker is used if the set score is 6-6 (first to 7, win by 2)
- Same 12-point tiebreaker applies for the second set, unless there is a time limitation (see above).
