

BCWTL Indoor Tiebreaker Rules

(applies only to matches with a 2 Hour Time Limitation)

At 10 minutes prior to 2- hour time block, finish game in progress with no-AD scoring.

- A 9-point tiebreaker is first to 5 points (no need to win by 2).
- If the 9-point tiebreak is tied 4-4, next point is receiver's choice.
- Each player serves twice, starting from the deuce side.
- No switching sides, complete the entire tiebreaker on the same sides.

If a team is ahead by 2 games or more, they are awarded the set.

If games are tied, a 9-point tiebreaker is played to determine winner of set.

If a team is ahead by only one game, another no-AD game is played to determine winner of set.

If results in games being tied, a 9-point tiebreaker is played to determine winner of set.

If the set is awarded to the team that won the first set, they are the winner of the match.

If the set is awarded to the team that lost the first set, a 9-point tiebreaker is played to determine the winner of the match.
